We teach the children personal safety skills so they can look after themselves in situations which could be upsetting or dangerous. It also deals with common situations which most children will experience at some stage or other e.g. getting lost or being bullied. Message from the HSE

Medical/Care Needs

At Lisnagry N.S., we prioritise the wellbeing and success of every student. If your child has any medical or care needs that may require an individual plan or extra support, we encourage you to

get in touch with us. By working together, we can ensure that your child receives the necessary care and support to thrive academically and personally.

Special Class

The Board of Management of Lisnagry N.S. has recently been sanctioned by the National Council for Special Education to open a special class for pupils with Autism in September 2025. This class aims to offer an autistic specific learning environment within a mainstream primary school. The setting will facilitate optimum inclusion, integration and reverse integration as part of the school community with access to mainstream classrooms and activities as appropriate. The class will cater for a maximum of 6 pupils and at its maximum will have one teacher and 2 Special Needs Assistants. Special Needs Assistants will be assigned in accordance with the enrolment of pupils.

No Smartphone Voluntary Code

We hope to launch the No Smartphone Voluntary Code in the next few weeks. The three schools in the Parish with the support of the Parents Association as well as some local clubs are involved also. There are three pillars to the charter.

- 1. No smartphones for primary school aged children.
- 2. No social media for primary school aged children.
- 3. Respect the age rating on video games.

We are taking this step as we have experienced growing concern around smartphones and social media. In addition to bullying, teachers are reporting a decrease in attention levels, as well as a decrease in children's ability to perform basic motor skills such as holding a pencil or throwing a ball. Further details will follow.

Outdoor Sensory Space

As mentioned previously, all our school fundraising efforts this year are going towards developing an outdoor sensory/play space for our pupils. We would really appreciate your help with this. If anyone could donate their time, expertise or perhaps to sponsor or part sponsor the cost of some feature of the outdoor space, please contact the school. We really do need your support to ensure this initiative comes to fruition. We are confident it will be very beneficial to have this outdoor space for all our pupils and even more so now with a special class opening in September. There may be local companies or potential corporate sponsors you know of who would like to be part of this worthy initiative.

School Marathon Relay

Our next fundraiser this school year will be our school marathon relay. It will be held on Wednesday 26th March during the school day. This novel event will bring our full school community together to complete the distance of a marathon. All pupils are able to take part and hopefully some teachers will don their running shoes too! Together we will run the distance of a marathon 42,195 metres in a relay form on our new running track. Sponsorship cards will be sent home in the weeks before it and all proceeds will go to our outdoor sensory/play space.
