Junior Entrepreneur Programme Over the past few months, 5th Class A have been taking part in the Junior Entrepreneur Programme. This exciting initiative gives 5th class students the opportunity to experience real-life business in a fun and engaging way. Running over a 12 to 16 week period during the school year, the programme encourages creativity, independence, and problem-solving skills, all while seamlessly integrating with the primary school curriculum.5<sup>th</sup>Class A have created their very own product- Mystery Sweet Bags. They've brought their product from the idea stage through market research and design to near completion. These hand-designed lucky bags, featuring a mixture of sweets and a collectible character, will be on sale in the school in Term 3, first come first served.

**Cycle Safety Training** Our 6th class pupils recently completed a fun and informative cycling safety course delivered by *Like Bikes* over four, two-hour sessions. This programme follows CYCLE RIGHT, the official National Standard for Cycle Safety Training in Ireland, and was taught by experienced, qualified instructors. The focus throughout the course was on building confidence, control, and awareness, helping our pupils become safer, more independent cyclists. This training supports our school's ongoing commitment to encouraging healthy habits, road safety, and daily physical activity.

<u>Student Council</u> Congratulations to our newly appointed student council in Lisnagry. They are looking forward to representing their classes and working together to help with activities and contributing to important decisions for our school. Well done to all! No Smartphone Voluntary Code – A Community Effort! We're delighted to have launched our No Smartphone Voluntary Code across our community. This initiative is supported by the three local schools and three local clubs, and we encourage all families to take some time to sit down together, review the code, and consider signing the charter. Although voluntary, we truly hope you will give it thoughtful consideration. Every child has received a copy of the code—please keep it at home and pop it on the fridge as a daily reminder of our shared values. The code is built around three key pillars:

- No smartphones for primary school-age children
- No social media for primary school-age children
- Respect the age ratings on video games

A huge thank you to all the community groups for their support in making this possible.

We believe this voluntary code is a valuable support tool for parents and guardians who may be unsure about when—and if—to introduce personal smartphones and social media to their children. It also opens the door for meaningful conversations at home about digital boundaries and age-appropriate content.

By agreeing collectively to delay the use of smartphones and social media, we can reduce peer pressure, support one another, and create a more balanced digital environment for our children.

**Field Trips** Each year, our senior pupils eagerly anticipate engaging field trips and excursions that take them outside the classroom, offering them invaluable real-world experiences. These outings not only bring learning to life but also foster independence, curiosity, and social development.

- 4th Class: The pupils had a fantastic day at King John's Castle. They loved exploring the historic site, learning about its rich past, and even stepping back in time as they uncovered the castle's secrets. Such experiences help students connect historical knowledge with tangible places and events.

This is a wonderful and important development for our school, and for families in the local and the surrounding areas. Supporting children with autism in a local setting is something we're deeply committed to, and we see this as a positive step toward greater inclusion. We're especially excited to further develop an autismfriendly culture within Lisnagry-one where every child feels understood, accepted, and supported. Our staff are looking forward to this new beginning, and to working closely with parents and the wider community as we embark on this journey together.

Bí Cineálta At Lisnagry, we are committed to fostering a safe, inclusive, and supportive environment for all our students. We are proud of the progress we have made over the years in promoting anti-bullying initiatives and are eager to continue building on this strong foundation.
